The Chautauqua Safety Village operates on grant funding, donations, and fundraisers. The support of our generous community helps upkeep our unique facility and allows us to offer a variety of safety-related programs. Your donation will help us promote community safety through education.

History

In 1996, members from the Sertoma Club of Jamestown visited the impressive Waterloo Safety Village in Canada. Upon their return, they approached Sheriff Joe Gerace about starting a similar village in Chautauqua County. After further research, Sheriff Gerace was convinced, and stated "we have to do something like this for the children in our community."

A 501C-3 organization was formed with a board of local community members. After years of meetings and generous community efforts, twenty-six 12' x 24' concrete slabs were poured on the 5-acre piece of property next to the Hewes Educational Facility in Ashville, NY. Herman Kent Post 777 was the first to build an on-site miniature building, followed by the AAA and the Jamestown Chapter of Credit Unions. Upon receiving the TEP Grant, a \$1.76 million federal award, the educational and storage facility used to house the cars, bikes, and "Chautauqua Safety Village Express" train was built.

After years of work, the Chautauqua Safety Village now includes paved roads, sidewalks, street signs, a railroad crossing, streetlights, a four-way traffic signal, and additional new building sites for sponsors. The village is busy with children driving electric cars along its streets, pedestrians crossing the crosswalks, and bicyclists demonstrating their hand signals. The main education facility, sponsored by DFT Communications, houses the newly renovated lobby, two classrooms, a mock apartment, a conference room, restrooms, and more. Students are taught fire, traffic, poison, and gun safety in a variety of fun ways, including practicing a fire escape under simulated smoke, an exhibit with the children's favorite, "Sparky the Fire Dog," and the state of the art interactive floor.

Since opening in Fall 2010, over **31,000** children have visited the village, and countless more have felt the community impact.

Honoring true heroes...

The Chautauqua Safety Village honored a six-year old girl, Madelyn Petscher, and two-year old St. Bernard, Nana, for saving family members from a house fire.

On January 17th, 2012, Menash Petscher woke up to Nana relentlessly licking his face, a behavior unlike her. He soon found out that she was alerting him of the fire that would soon engulf his family's home. Menash managed to get his wife and daughters out of the house safely.

Before the fire, Menash's daughter Madelyn, attended a field trip to the Chautauqua Safety Village. Upon her return home that day, she insisted that the family practice their escape plan and establish a safe meeting place. Thanks to Madelyn, her family was prepared for the emergency ahead.

Unfortunately, Nana and two of the family's cats, did not make it out of the house. Their bodies were found when the house was torn down, filling their families with both immense grief and gratitude.

Touched by these heroic efforts, a plaque with Nana's picture and the caption "A True Fire Hero" are displayed at the Chautauqua Safety Village. Beside this plaque is a photo of Madelyn, to commemorate her diligent efforts that are believed to have saved lives during a fire in her family home.

Penny's Testimonial

"My name is Penny Echard. I am the mother of five beautiful children, three of whom I was blessed to have only for a short time. Although it is hard for me to relive this story, I feel it is important for me to tell it. On April 1, 2002, I was scheduled to work at Cummins Engine and had to be there at 4:30am. Their grandparents offered to keep them overnight and get them to school the next morning. Unfortunately, morning never came for them. During the night, the wood stove caused a fire that claimed the lives of three of my children.

My oldest son, Billy, age 11, could have escaped from downstairs with his brother and cousin but instead attempted to rescue his two little sisters, Danielle, age 6, and Janel. age 4, who has been sleeping upstairs. . . . Although I miss them everyday, I believe their lives were not lost in vain. Their pictures sit on a shelf at the Chautauqua Safety Village, in a bedroom dedicated to Billy for his heroic actions. . . . I firmly believe that if my children had the opportunity to attend the Chautauqua Safety Village training classes, they would be here today.

My plea is that you too, will see the importance of the training offered by the Chautauqua Safety Village, which is a not-for-profit organization that is sustained through fundraising efforts and donations. There are only a handful of these unique villages throughout the United States and the fact that we have one in our community is a privilege that is often overlooked. Programs & Classes



Traffic & Bike Safety (all ages)

Traffic and Bike Safety Courses teach students sign recognition, rules of the road, pedestrian and crosswalk safety. The opportunity to drive miniature cars, or ride bikes throughout the Village allows students to demonstrate their knowledge of street signs, hand signals, pedestrians crossing, and railroad safety. Taking the students on a train ride is another highlight as they review the road signs taught in the classroom. This course starts as early as Pre-K, advances with each grade, and builds on the previous year.

Heartsaver® Class (ages 12+)

First Aid, CPR and AED trainings teach CPR on adults, children, and infants, and how to use an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). The Basic Life Support (BLS) class is designed to provide healthcare professionals the ability to recognize several life-threatening emergencies, perform CPR using an AED, and perform the Heimlich Maneuver for choking victims. Students will receive a 2 year certification. The Safety Village is certified through the American Heart Association and National Safety Council.

Fire Safety (all ages)

The Fire Safety Course offers first-hand house fire experience. Under simulated smoke, students are taught to stay low by crawling on their hands and knees. Our custom-made heated door teaches students how to identify if there is fire on the other side, by feeling with the back of their hand. After determining the safest route, students exit the mock home using a window escape ladder, and gather at the established meeting place. The instructor, after making sure everyone is out, places a mock 911 call. This Fire Safety Training accurately simulates real life emergencies. Teaching students in this way promotes information retention, which when applied, can save the life of anyone involved in a fire. This course starts as early as Pre-K, advances with each grade, and builds on the previous year.

Babysitter Course (ages 12+)

This 5.5-hour class teaches: CPR and First Aid techniques for a child or infant*, Heimlich Maneuver for choking victims, injury prevention, and recognizing safety issues. Students learn behavior management, simple toddler-friendly snack/dinner prep, and bottle warming/infant meals. We discuss the importance of a babysitter checklist and provide an activity bag full of babysitting essentials

Poison, Gun, Parking Lot & Crosswalk Safety (Pre-K/Kindergarten)

Classes teach awareness to kids about the dangers of household poisons and medications. Following the Eddie Eagle Program, students are taught "if you see a gun, STOP! Don't touch! Leave the area! Tell an adult." Students are also taught to safely navigate potentially dangerous parking lots and crosswalks.

In-School Education (Middle/High School)

Instructors are available to teach in-school lessons covering: First Aid basics, child care for babysitting or siblings (changing, diapering, and feeding infants, and children's behavior management), Heimlich maneuver for infants and children, personal safety, hands-only CPR, and distracted driving.

First Aid (ages 9-13)

This 2-hour course teaches how to respond to and manage an emergency until Emergency Medical Services (EMS) arrives. Skills learned include applying pressure to a bleeding wound, treating sprains, broken bones, and other first-aid treatments.

Child Safety Seat Program

This program educates parents and community members about the proper use of child safety seats. Our certified safety seat technicians are available to assist with proper installation as well as provide safety checks.
